During the spring lockdown we have been focusing on producing RE resources for primary schools. We were able to produce a pre-recorded collective worship on the topic of 'Perseverance' for Reigate Parish school, and we also produced a collective worship on the topic of Easter which was received by 20 local primary schools.

Our main project this term has been the production of our Easter digital resource 'The Time Detective Agency: In The Case Of The Missing Body'. This is a 30 minute drama written by Charles Merritt where two detectives explore the first Easter story. We were able to combine some 'in person' scenes with staff members with the interviews of characters via video link to create the

drama. We are very grateful to our team of volunteer actors, Charles who edited and produced the film and Reigate Baptist church who provided us with a filming location. We have already had some lovely feedback from a school who have used the film resource, and are really pleased that we were able to provide a digital resource in place of our usual live performances this year. We look forward to the possibility of being able to return to our 'live' RE events in the next academic year.
