The team, trustees and volunteers worked so hard in 2023 and there were some real highlights:

- Christmas Journey launched in Horley for the first time with a brand new Horley team
- Lindsey and Lizzie designed and led brand new workshops on transition in Carrington School for all of the Year 7's
- Charlie and his team delivered 18 Think! spaces across the year, engaging with over 4,140 students
- Lizzie delivered one-to-one mentoring and group work support to over 100 students
- Lindsey launched brand new Christmas lessons with the help of RE Inspired in Reigate Parish and St Matthew's Schools
- A team from Holy Trinity launched Open the Book in Wray Common Primary School
- Jo kept everything going behind the scenes whilst working on the finance and administration

And that was just to mention some of the activities that were delivered last year!

It is truly inspiring to see all that God is doing in the local schools and we are so excited for the year to come! The staff and trustees are meeting in the new term to discuss the vision of SparkFish and will be asking God what He wants us to be delivering over the next few years in the local schools and local area.

#### Learn

We have had an exciting few months with the Learn strand work which focuses on supporting schools with their RE curriculum. The Christmas Journey 2023 ran very well with 14 classes from 7 schools visiting in Redhill, 14 classes from 8 schools in Reigate, and 11 classes from 6 schools visited the Christmas Journey in Horley. Overall, we saw around 1100 children over the three weeks which was very exciting. The Christmas Journey is an interactive 'walk through' of the Christmas story with actors, puppets, storytellers and craft activities.

We would not have been able to run the Christmas Journey without the support of our staff, trustees, and a large group of volunteers, and the churches which hosted us, Redhill Methodist, Reigate Park Church and St Bartholomew's Church in Horley.

We had some very positive feedback:

"We had a brilliant day. It was organised so beautifully and the children were fully involved throughout! It must have taken so much planning and thought!"

It was also great to support the new Open the Book team at Wray Common on 7th December as we led an assembly on 'The Annunciation', and the school has asked for Open the Book dates for Spring term 2024.

At the end of the Autumn term Charlie and I led lessons on 'Has Christmas lost it's true meaning?' at two schools for Year 3 classes resourced by RE Inspired. The lessons went well, and I was very grateful to the knitters from Holy Trinity Church and to Charlie for knitting two sets of Nativity figures for us to use for telling the Christmas story in the lessons.

We are now looking forward to our Easter experience production which starts imminently. We are very grateful to our team of volunteer actors who have been busy rehearsing and learning lines in preparation.
