Learn

It is exciting to be back in our local schools again after the long summer break and we have been busy planning and preparing for our RE events this academic year.

The first of our major events is our 'Christmas Journey' where we run an interactive RE lesson for school Year two to explore why Christmas is important for Christians. The children can explore the Christmas story with music and song, craft, drama, puppets and storytelling. This would not be possible without our large team of volunteers from local churches, and the support of our three venue churches, Redhill Methodist Church, Reigate Park Church, and St Batholomew's Church in Horley. Schools have been booking their Year 2 classes to come along and we look forward to welcoming them again this year.

During the Autumn term we are supporting two local 'Open the Book' assembly teams, visiting schools to share Bible stories using drama. This term so far, we have shared the story of Jesus walking on water, and the story of Jesus being baptised. We are also taking bookings for our school Year 3 Christmas lesson which we lead as part of our partnership with RE Inspired. We lead an hour's interactive RE lesson on the topic of 'Has Christmas lost it's true meaning?' and have bookings to visit schools later this term.



Our work at SparkFish includes supporting young people at times of challenge and change, so I am involved this term in supporting children regularly in St Matthew's and Furzefield Primary Schools. We are also leading a series of workshops for the new Year 7 students at Carrington School on the topic of 'friendships and social interactions' as part of their Excellence programme, which is a great opportunity to support students at the beginning of their time at Secondary School.

I am thrilled to share some exciting updates about our Think Spaces! For those who may not be familiar, a Think Space is a dedicated area and time in a busy school environment for students to reflect on what truly matters. I am reminded of Proverbs 22:6 which says, "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old, he will not depart from it."

My prayer for each Think Space is that the children who attend gain a deep appreciation for pausing, being still, and taking time to think about faith, spirituality, their emotions, and life's big questions. In our modern world, especially for young people, there is so much to fit into the day - so many things on the to-do-list, clubs to attend, homework to complete. Having an opportunity to pause and be still is rare and often impossible. Young people love the time they are given in a Think Space to do this, and if they can build in a similar time into their own lives, it opens up more possibilities for them to think about things that really matter.

This term we were delighted to lead several Think Spaces in local schools. Micklefield School's Think Space took place in October and focused on the topic of responsibility. The activities guided students in understanding how to be responsible friends, care for the planet, and look after themselves. The children also had the chance to pray and create their own prayer boxes, which helped them reflect on kindness and responsibility in all their actions.

Additionally, I am excited to visit Reigate School each week for one-to-one mentoring sessions with students who need support and a listening ear. I am passionate about coming alongside young people, meeting them where they are, and supporting them on their life's journey. With experience as a Youth Pastor in various capacities, I have had many wonderful opportunities to mentor young people, and I am thrilled to bring this experience to Reigate School.
